Gadirli Medical School. At the same time, she performed as an amateur actress, singer and dancer in the amateur circle of the school.

Mahluga Sadigova played the role of Yengya (the woman who accompanies the bride to her fiance's house on the wedding day) in the play "Vagif" by the Azerbaijani poet Samed Vurgun more than 800 times, and more than 400 times the role of Peri

in the play (“Withered Flowers”) by the Azerbaijani playwright Jafar Jabbarli.

On July 21, 1949, Mahluga Sadigova was awarded the title of Honored Artist, and on January 10 (11), 1978, People's Artist of the Azerbaijan SSR. The actress was also elected a deputy of the Baku City Council of Working People.
